


AP® SEMINAR'S IMPACT

How does AP Seminar's skills-focused curriculum benefit students in high school and beyond?

In 2014, the Advanced Placement Capstone Diploma program was launched to offer high school students an opportunity to learn interdisciplinary critical thinking and collaboration skills and to complete academic research. AP Seminar and AP Research are different from other AP courses because students in the AP Capstone program are encouraged to ask and investigate their own questions. The Big Ideas in AP Seminar's QUEST cultivate, reiterate, and refine students' ability to Question and Explore, Understand and Analyze, Evaluate, Synthesize, and Team, Transform, and Transmit.

For schools interested in integrating AP Seminar into their English curriculum, College Board offers ELA-focused APSI options. Based on grade level exam results and data that shows the positive impact of AP Seminar on the number of AP courses a student takes and the exam scores they earn, College Board encourages placement of AP Seminar in the sophomore year, but most students at any grade level can benefit from access to AP Seminar.

Anecdotally, teachers and students report that the skills students practice and master in AP Seminar transcend the class as well as high school. Recent research confirms and expands on those observations.



According to research by Jagesic et al., students who took AP Seminar in high school were more likely than their peers to engage in academic research or an internship in college.
