¹ Each CRS consists of four 75-minute blocks with 15 min Q and A. Sessions typically run 9am to 3pm local time. Please note specific topics at each CRS may vary by location and date. ² All students attending a Content Review Session must be accompanied by a supervising teacher that remains onsite for the duration of the session. Prior to each CRS we will ask all teachers to verify rosters. Lunch is provided.

³ Science Content Review Sessions will focus on labs that don't easily fit into a traditional HS schedule giving students the opportunity to engage in some of the more challenging concepts in each course. ⁴ External scoring for English Language includes the Rhetorical Analysis and Argument Essays. Teachers and students will be guided through deconstruction of the Synthesis essay at the final CRS. Similarly, external scoring for English Literature includes the Poem and Prose Fiction essay. Teachers and students will be guided through deconstruction of the Analysis essay at the Final CRS.
